



Three Day Cowra Itinerary

Day One

Settle in to your chosen accommodation venue. Most offer dinner by request or there are plenty of other options within Cowra.

Day Two

For the early riser Champagne Flights are available at Balloon Joy Flights in Canowindra (twenty minute drive from Cowra). Bookings are essential. Canowindra is home to the Age of Fishes Museum, numerous Antique and Old Ware's shops and the Old Vic Inn with their award winning restaurant and gallery. Also featured in Canowindra is Taste Canowindra with their large selection of local wines and the Canowindra Trading Post, a beautiful building featuring an eclectic selection of fine wares.

Visit Cowra's Visitor Information Centre to view the amazing hologram, a nine minute presentation that tells the story of the Cowra Breakout. Also take some time to stop and smell the roses at Cowra's Rose Garden. It features 130 varieties of roses and some 880 bushes!

Cowra's Japanese Garden and Cultural Centre is a wonderful place to visit no matter what the season. After strolling through the magnificent gardens you may like to relax over lunch at the café where you have a choice of dining al fresco overlooking the lake, or inside in air-conditioned comfort.

Take in some of Cowra's history, strolling through the ruins at the POW Campsite, the cherry trees on Sakura Avenue and visiting the Cowra Australian and Japanese War Cemeteries.

Visit Australia's replica of the World Peace Bell, awarded to Cowra for its long standing contribution to world peace and international understanding.



The Heritage Walk takes you on a stroll past some of Cowra's Historical buildings, stopping off at Cowra's wine tasting venue "The Mill"

Cowra's War, Rail & Rural Museum, is situated on the Bathurst road five kilometres east of Cowra, for the young at heart or the serious train buff.

Darbys Falls Observatory. Open every night by appointment. Take a closer look at the southern hemisphere's night sky.

Day Three

Drive to Sunnyside for a Bungling Bushranger Hold-up of the Coach and lunch in Air-conditioned Comfort. After being held up by the bungling bushrangers make your way to Sunnyside, Scenic Road, Wirrimah, a half hour from Cowra. Sunnyside offers great family entertainment with bush poetry and also easy listening live music while you dine on a delicious buffet lunch, enjoy relaxing Clydesdale carriage rides around the beautiful gardens which includes over 2000 landscaped roses.

Upon request, a tour of the amazing landra Castle can be arranged; it is only a short drive and an interesting and wondrous spectacle.

Cowra has a great history of quality wine production and there are several cellar doors located within a 10km radius of the town centre. From art galleries to garage cellars, there is something for every wine enthusiast!

The Quarry Restaurant, nestled amongst the vineyards is a great place for an a la carte dinner or light lunch. You can also taste and purchase several local wines through their Wine Cellars.
